1. Each farm product must have been grown by the exhibitor in the current year.
2. All entries must be in place between 1:00pm and 6:00pm Tuesday.
3. **There is no entry fee in this department.**
4. All exhibits that are not properly classified or do not fulfil the rules of the department and of the premium list shall be disqualified.
5. No exhibitor may have more than one entry in any class.
6. When fewer than three entries are made in a class, the judge will award the premium(s) which, in his/her opinion, the quality warrants.
7. Allowance will be made for the exhibition of unripe products in classes where harvest does not coincide with Fair dates.
8. Class 69 pays \$6. \$5. \$3. All other classes pay \$3. \$2. & \$1. except class 77 which pays \$10. \$5. & \$3.
9. Exhibits will be released after 4:00 pm Sunday. Anyone leaving before this time without permission of the Superintendent will forfeit all premiums.
