

DEPARTMENT H FLOWER SHOW

1. All plants must have been **GROWN** by the exhibitor.
2. There are no entry fees in this department.
3. All named varieties of plants and flowers exhibited for premiums or other awards must include the **correct name of the plant** written legibly or typed on a 3"x5" card.
4. Plants in pots must show skillful culture of bloom or decorative foliage and beauty, symmetry, and vigor of specimen.
5. All plants exhibited as pot plants must have been grown in pots or other suitable containers; they must not have been lifted from the ground and put into pots or other containers.
6. No plant or flower will be entitled to a prize or other award unless they possess points of superiority and no award will be made to unworthy specimens, though they may be the only ones of their kind on display.
7. No Styrofoam or paper cups will be allowed as vases or pots.
8. A display is an arrangement of flowers or plants for effect and is subject to the same considerations as any other flower arrangement. A display is judged based on cultural perfection and (1) distinctiveness, (2) relation of flowers to the container, (3) color harmony, (4) proportion and (5) arrangement or placement of blooms.
9. Each exhibitor should read the rules carefully and follow them.
10. A rosette will be given for **Best of Show** in sections 1 and 3.
11. Sections 1 and 2 pay \$2.-1st place. Section 3 pays \$3- 1st place. Section 4 pays \$5- 1st place.
12. Exhibits will be released after 2:00pm on Sunday. Anyone leaving before this time without permission of the Superintendent will forfeit all premiums.

DEPARTMENT H-A JUNIOR FLOWER SHOW

Exhibitors must not have passed their 19th birthday on January 1st of the current year.

General rules and classes for this department are the same as for Department H.

If juniors wish to exhibit in the open class, they may not use the same flowers or plants for both Open and Junior class. Exhibits in each class are to be in an independent dish.

In addition to the classes listed above, the following classes are open to Junior competitors only.

All these collections are to consist of not fewer than ten plants; all of which must be pressed, mounted, labeled and covered with a clear protective overlay. These may be mounted on a poster of at least 22"x28" or may be placed on an 8.5"x11" paper in a notebook.
