The show will begin promptly at 2:00pm. Showmanship classes will be held at 1:00pm.

Entry Fee: \$2.00

ENTRIES MUST BE POSTMARKED BY JULY 15, 2025. Late Entries are accepted strictly on an available basis and must pay a \$3.00 per class fee in addition to regular entry fee.

ALL LATE ENTRIES MUST CALL SUPERINTENDENT.

Please refer to State Regulations for livestock health requirements (sec. 351.4). Entries are open to residents of Madison, Herkimer, Oneida, Otsego, Cortland and Chenango counties only. Each farm address is limited to a maximum of 20 head total.

- 1. All animals to be shown in group classes must also be shown in their individual classes. No entry fees will be refunded.
- 2. Animals may start arriving at 11:00am. ALL MUST be in place by 4:30pm Saturday, July 26, 2025. Animals may arrive on the day of the show with superintendent's approval; please have health papers ready prior to check in.
- 3. Exhibitors are STRONGLY encouraged to stay the entire show. Anyone leaving before this time without the permission of the Superintendent will forfeit all premiums.
- 4. Limit two prizes in one class to a farm or consignor.
- 5. All animals will be brought out of the pen to be shown. Failure to do so will cause forfeiture of premium.
- 6. Exhibitors will supply their own bedding and feed. Exhibitors will clean the pen area at the close of the fair and pile manure in the designated area.
- 7. Registered stock will be in name of the exhibitor of immediate family. Proof of ownership is to be based on date of registration (30 days from transfer). All registered entries must carry the registration tag of their breed in their ear. All registration papers must be available show day.
- 8. Sheep not registered must be shown in the commercial class.
- 9. No market lamb will be shown with more than 1" of wool. All market lambs are to be shorn within 30 days of the fair and are to have been born after January 1st of the current year.
- 10. The judge may refuse or reject any exhibit which is in his/her opinion not worthy or representative of its breed.
- 11. All sheep will be examined by a state veterinarian. Exhibitors will be present and have a health certificate signed by an accredited veterinarian that his/her flock is free of all infectious disease and not under quarantine. Any sheep showing evidence of infectious or contagious disease, internal or external parasites, or in generally unthrifty condition will cause dismissal of the entire flock.
- 12. All animals will be required to show proof of Rabies vaccination and current health papers.
- 13. The decision of the judge is final in all cases.
- 14. Premium checks will be mailed.

Classes are divided by the following and are the same for all breeds:

Junior Lambs – born on or after 2/16 current year.

Intermediate Lambs – born 1/1 - 2/15 current year.

Senior Lambs – born 9/1 - 12/31 previous year.

Junior Yearling Ewes – born 1/1 - 8/31 previous year.

Senior Yearling Ewes – born 9/1 - 12/31, to be 12-24 months of age

Section 26- Market Lambs (Shown after the breed classes)

No market lamb will be shown with more than 1 inch or wool. All market lambs to be judged on a market basis- ewes or whether- **NO RAMS**.

Classes for Section 26

- 1. Market Lamb- Light weight
- 2. Market Lamb- Medium weight
- 3. Market Lamb- Heavy weight
- 4. Pen of Three Lambs

Section 27 - Wool Fleece

To be judged after all sheep have been shown.

- 1. The exhibitor may enter not more than two fleeces per class from sheep owned by him/her.
- 2. All fleeces will have been shorn since December of the previous year.
- 3. Fleeces should be rolled skin side out and placed in a clear plastic bag.
- 4. Fleeces may be opened by the Judge.
- 5. Each fleece will have a tag with the exhibitor's name.
- 6. Fleece will be rejected if it has paint, tar, excessive vegetation matter, weak staples or broken fiber.
- 7. Fleeces will be displayed in the sheep barn and cared for by the superintendent.

CLASSES for Section 27

- 1. Fine wool (Finn, Merino, and other fine wool breeds)
- 2. Medium Wool (Columbia, Corriedale, Southdown and other medium wool breeds/crosses)
- 3. Long Wool (Romney, Border Leicester, Cotswold and other breeds/crosses)
- 4. Naturally Colored Wool Fine
- 5. Naturally Colored Wool Medium
- 6. Naturally Colored Wool Coarse

SHOWMANSHIP

No pre-entry is required.

CLASSES for Section 28

1. Novice -1^{st} year of showing

2. Junior – Ages 13 & under

3. Senior - Ages 14 - 18

4. Adult

SHEPARD AWARD

This award is given to the exhibitor that shows attentiveness to their flock, pride in decorating their pens, overall care and cleanliness of their area.

DEPARTMENT U-A JUNIOR SHEEP

All juniors must be entered in open classes (with entry fee). No entry fee for junior classes. Exhibitors who have turned 19 by January 1, 2025, are not eligible. Junior exhibitors will show with open entries but be awarded junior ribbons.

DRESS CODE

Please be mindful that while showing sheep we are often bending over to reach our animal for positioning. Both tops and bottoms are to always be concealed. If you do not have a shirt that will prevent exposure, one will be provided for you to wear during the show. What constitutes proper (or improper) dress is at the sole discretion of the Superintendent or MCF Board of Directors.
